## FIREFIGHTER ENSEMBLE

“DO’S & DON’Ts”

**DO—Launder your gear every 6 months,**  
and more if necessary

**DO—Routinely inspect your gear**  
for any signs of damage or wear.

**DO—Fasten all closures prior to**  
laundering, insuring that all hooks are  
fastened, snaps are closed, and any  
hook and loop is covered.

**DO—Machine wash your gear using a**  
front load extractor (if possible) at a  
water temperature no warmer than  
105 degrees.

**Do—Allow your gear to dry in a well**  
ventilated area and out of sunlight.

**DON'T—Store your garment where it is**  
exposed to Ultra Violet Rays.

**DON'T—use chlorine bleach, hydrogen**  
peroxide, or “OXY” cleaners.

**DON'T—Use gear that is soiled, torn,**  
damaged, or otherwise compromised.
